CREDIT CARDS SHALL BE ILLEGAL



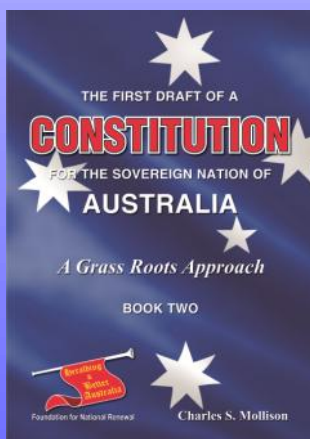
From **The First Draft of a [new] Constitution for Australia ...**
